



How will new approaches to development change our suburbs, towns and regions?



Historical development (e.g. 1960s)

More lawn, trees and gardens than roofs and paved areas.

Business as usual (e.g. 2000s–now)

One tenth (or less) of the property is permeable (gardens, grass, trees).

The future (we can design)

More than a third of the property vegetated and most driveways and paths are permeable.

What the workshops will help us achieve

The workshops will:

- provide practical expert assistance in navigating and preparing effective responses to influence the draft Code
- gather feedback and prepare a summary for government.

Join us to discuss proposed policy on:

- site coverage/reduced hard paved surfaces
- minimum landscaped areas
- minimum tree planting for shade and amenity
- enhanced biodiversity
- rainwater tanks and other stormwater runoff management solutions.

Participants will be able to view and comment on a series of illustrated development scenarios that represent:

- business-as-usual development
- development that just passes the new policy (proposed minimum standards)
- what we call 'cooler, greener' development that goes beyond minimum standards for enhanced greening, stormwater management and amenity.

Outcomes from the workshops will be compiled and submitted to the Planning Commission by the 28 February 2019 due date.
